# Anti-Bullying Advice for Parents



Working together, we succeed

#### Our aims:

At Crookhill, we aim to create and provide a caring, friendly and safe environment for all of our members so they can learn, grow and flourish in a secure and supportive atmosphere. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at our school and will not be tolerated. Any member of the Crookhill community: pupil, employee or volunteer, has the right to learn and work without the fear of being bullied. If bullying does occur, all incidents will be dealt with sensitively, promptly and effectively with the full co-operation of the school.

### What is bullying?

"Bullying is behaviour by an individual or group, usually repeated over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically, psychologically or emotionally."

We understand that children can have disagreements and can fall out with friends for a time. This is not usually described as bullying.

Bullying can be described in different categories:

Emotional ~ being unfriendly, tormenting, excluding from groups

Physical ~ pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any form of violence

Verbal ~ name calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours

Cyber ~ sending offensive or degrading images through any means of the internet, making threats through emails or texts

### How does the school address bullying?

- Buddy System
- ♦ Worry Boxes

- Open door policy ~ working in partnership with parents/carers and pupils to resolve situations
- Treating all allegations seriously and in accordance with our Anti-Bullying Policy

### What should I do if my child is being bullied?

You can discuss this leaflet and 'Bullying' with your child at home.

You should speak to your child's teacher or member of the Senior Leadership Team.

All allegations of bullying are taken seriously and dealt with immediately.
