<b>English Activities</b>	
	All children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 have access to LEXIA. Their login information has already been sent home. Please try and use LEXIA 3 x per week for 20 minutes at a time.
	Children in Years 1 and 2 can access Spelling shed. Please practise the Year 1/2 words for 10 minutes each day.
	Oxford Owl has a free e-book library which children can access online. Select books at your current reading stage and make sure you read each day. No log in required.
	<p>Login into Purple Mash and have a go at the phonics activities in the English section. Choose from phases 2-5 depending on where your child is working. Your child's teacher will advise you on which phase will be best to work on.</p> <p>Children in Reception can access the English and Maths game on Mini Mash using their Purple Mash login.</p>
	BBC Bitesize has a number of English Lessons linked to your Child's current stage of learning. There are more lessons being added throughout the term. No log in required.
	Search on You Tube for 'dough gym / dough disco' videos. Children should use playdough or any malleable material and follow the video to support development of their fine motor skills. Complete the letter formation / handwriting sheets in your pack afterwards.

<b>Maths Activities</b>	
	Year 2 pupils can access My Maths. Logins have been sent home. There are a range of lessons, games and activities linked to your child's current stage of learning. Aim to complete at least three lessons per week.
	Year 2 pupils should login 3x per week and play for 10 minutes each time.
	Maths games can be found on the Purple Mash website in the Games section. Just use your purple mash login and select Maths.
